Since 1922, the neighborhood of Forest Hills has been a gemstone of Indianapolis. Its unmistakable character differs from most of the Meridian-Kessler neighborhood in which it resides, with its wooded lots and winding streets, home to Tudor Revivals, American Four Squares, and charming Bungalows.



Events

Unlike many urban neighborhoods, Forest Hills has maintained a neighborhood association for its entire existence. The association fosters the sort of connectivity that doesn't exist in other parts of the city. The neighborhood's **Halloween party** is considered the oldest continuous neighborhood event in Indianapolis, with its **Summer Picnic** a close second. People from all over Indianapolis travel to see Forest Hills' beautiful **Christmas Eve luminaries**, and the **annual garage sale** is deemed one of the best in the city.

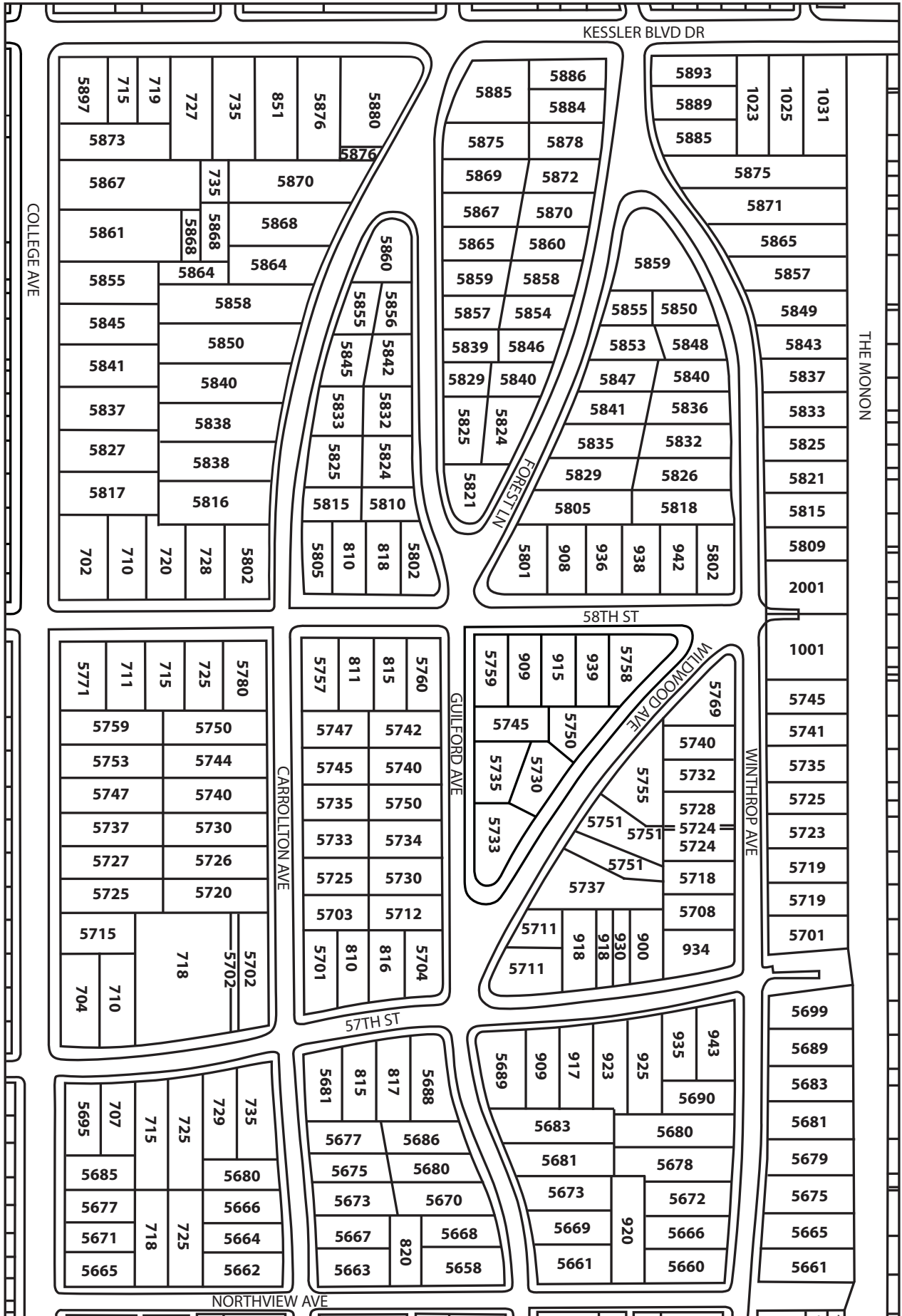
Location

Walking distance to two great grocery stores, Kroger and The Fresh Market, Forest Hills residents stroll to the entertainment hot spot of **Broad Ripple**, or head south to dine at Mama Carolla's, Yats, Mo & Johnny's and the Midwest's premier jazz club, The Jazz Kitchen. Many of our kids still walk or bike to school. **We border the Monon Trail**, which stretches from Carmel to downtown Indy and connects to the Central Towpath to the west. Parks and churches of all denominations are equally close. We're also on a bus line, so the commute downtown is a mere twenty minutes.
