#### The restaurant spotlight is a new section of The Columns

We're excited to launch this segment with a Broad Ripple staple, Rene's Bakery. Below is our interview with Albert Trevino, founder and owner of Rene's Bakery.

#### Q: How did you decide to become a baker?

A: I became a baker because I wanted to be steadily employed. Soon after I realized that I really enjoyed baking and pastry and that it could be a career path I was looking for.

Here are a few places that have shaped my baking style, Just Desserts, Something Different/Snax, The Bakehouse in Bloomington IN, Ettore in Sacramento CA, Columbia Club, Tavola Di TOSA, and Meridian Hills Country Club.

#### Q: How did you choose the current location to open your business?

A: When I was ready to open my own bakery, I looked at locations in Fountain Square, downtown off Mass. Avenue and here, the recently closed Tavola di TOSA. I originally came by to talk to the landlord about purchasing equipment and walked away with a lease.

#### Q: How did you choose the name Rene's?

A: The name Rene's Bakery came from my little used middle name, Rene. As a kid, I thought it sounded too girly. As an adult, it sounds Frenchy and a lot of our baked goods are of French origins.

#### Q: What is the most popular pastry you sell? Which is your personal favorite?

A: The almond croissant, macarons, and eclairs are probably our most popular desserts. My favorite is the Sarah Bernhardt, an amaretti topped with chocolate mousse and dipped in chocolate, then garnished with gold leaf.

#### Q: Do you have any connections, thoughts, or memories of Forest Hills?

A: Forest Hills is one of my favorite neighborhoods to walk in. Friendly folks and nice looking homes
